Thomas Fisher is a Professor and Dean of the College of Design at the University of Minnesota. Educated at Cornell University in architecture and Case Western Reserve University in intellectual history, he previously served as the Regional Preservation Officer at the Western Reserve Historical Society in Cleveland, the Historical Architect of the Connecticut State Historical Commission in Hartford, and the Editorial Director of Progressive Architecture magazine in Stamford, Connecticut. He has lectured or juried at 35 different schools of architecture and 58 professional societies, and has published 34 book chapters and 247 major articles in various magazines and journals. He has published five books over the last eight years: *In the Scheme of Things*, *Alternative Thinking on the Practice of Architecture*; *Salmela Architect*; *Lake/Flato Buildings and Landscapes*; *Designing for Designers*; and *Architectural Design and Ethics, Tools for Survival*.
