

PAUL A. LONGLEY
University College London

Paul Longley is Professor of Geographic Information Science at University College London, where he also serves as Deputy Director of the Centre for Advanced Spatial Analysis (CASA) and Site Manager for the ‘Spatial Literacy in Teaching’ Centre of Excellence in Teaching and Learning. He holds three degrees (B.Sc.; Ph.D. and D.Sc.) from the University of Bristol. He was previously Lecturer, Reader and Professor of Geography at the Bristol University (1992–2000), Lecturer in Planning at Cardiff (1984–1992) and Lecturer in Geography at Reading University (1983–1984).

He has held c. 37 grants, principally from UK research councils but also from external organisations (city councils, central government, the software industry, police authorities). He has acted as primary or second advisor to 35 Ph.D. students. Publications include 10 books, over 100 refereed journal articles or book chapters and a further 70 technical reports, book reviews and journal commentaries. From 1997–2007 he was Editor-in-Chief of *Computers, Environment and Urban Systems*, and he is a co-editor of *Environment and Planning B*. He has held 4 externally-funded (National Science Foundation and British Council) visiting appointments, spent two periods as an ESRC research fellow and has given many conference presentations and external seminars.
